What?

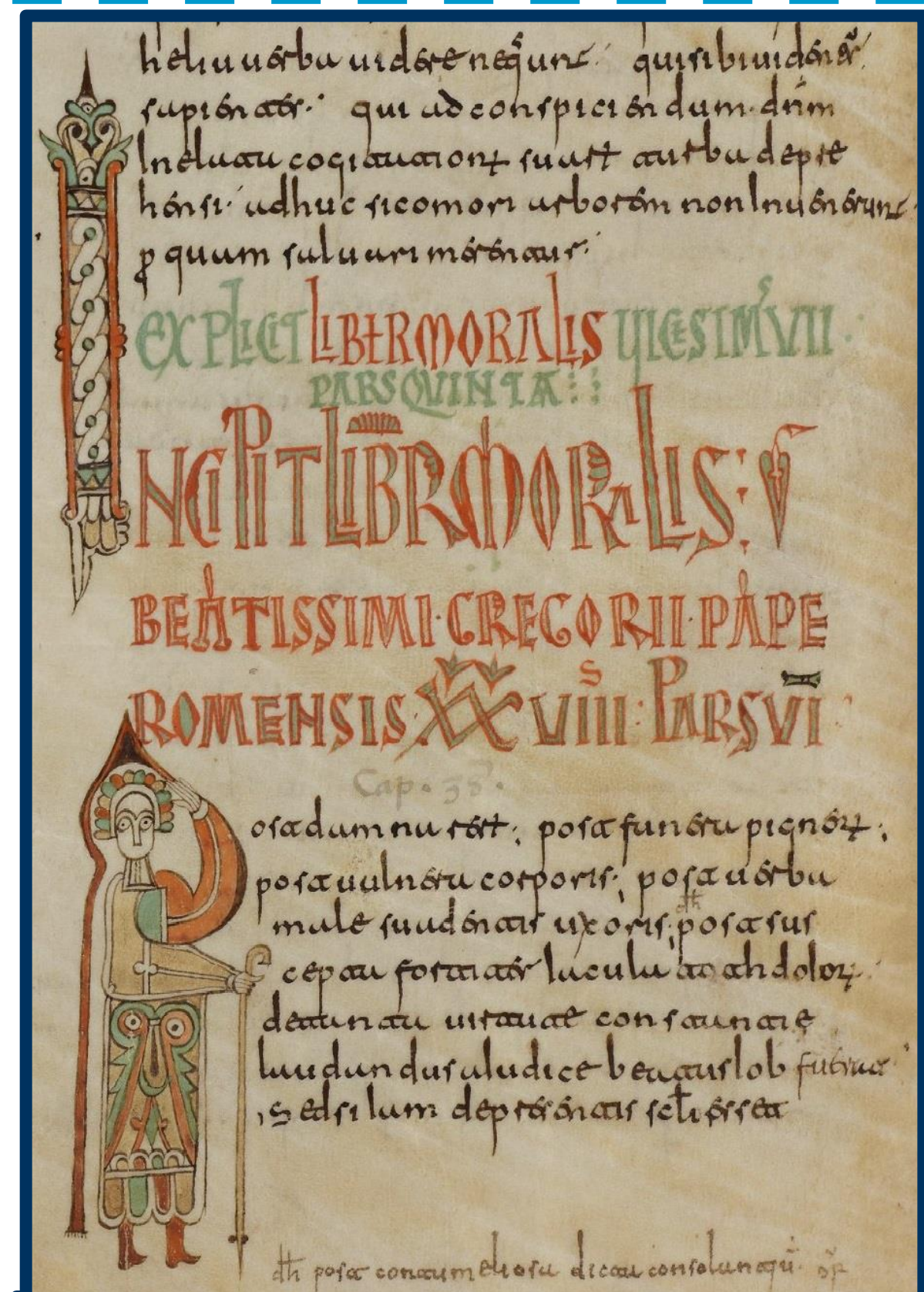
